JULY 14, 2026

**Secretary Report:** Approved by email

**Financial report:** Eric Ringquist presented the June financial report. Vote approved.

## **Executive Committee and Council Secretary elections**

- This created an opening on the executive committee, Aaron had previously spoken with Jen Hanson about filling the position. Keith suggested that
- Gary Gilbertson be considered. After discussion, Aaron appointed Jen Hanson to fill the final opening for the executive committee.
- Council meeting secretary – Allison Fisher volunteered to fill the role – vote approved

## **Executive Committee Report:** Aaron Bogott

- Tasha Foss is resigning as of 9/6/2026. There is an interview scheduled for this week for an individual to fill the position.
- Proposal made to extend Ben Webb's role as interim role associate pastor and to extend Rachel Bang's role as interim worship leader to 12/31/26. Vote approved

## **Pastor Nick Report:**

- **Council training and expectations for 2026-2026** – Training was conducted on council liaison responsibilities, Communion assistance, and trustee and deacon responsibilities
- **New Vision and Directives for our new Fiscal Year** – It is important for both our new council members and existing members to learn and/or review our church's annual objectives and rhythms, which impact our goals, processes, and church budget. We will be reviewing our vision path process. The council will also be asked to take a new Congregational Health Assessment, which our AFLC Home Mission is providing for us, and we will work with Pr. Andy Coyle on church renewal and revitalization.
- **Living Stone Ministry/Campus** – Discussed the implication of adding Pr. Holmes to Emmaus insurance and covering additional costs to staff etc. Pr Holmes will have access to an office at Emmaus, and Living Stone will be added to the website as an additional campus. Together, these items will support Pr. Holmes in maintaining his status in the United States
- **75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee Update** – The finance committee will receive the budget from the anniversary committee. The cost of the new directory will be a church expense. On 7/26 there will be a kiosk set up to sell tickets to the banquet

## **Ben Webb's Report:**

- **2026 AFLC Annual Conference report** – Ben discussed the implications of the conference vote to roster divorced men. Ultimately the choice to call a Pastor is in the hands of each church.
- **Home Groups** – Home group leaders were emailed a brief questionnaire. Ben will follow up with group leaders after VBS. Home group leadership training is scheduled for 8/26/26 at 5pm.
- **Spiritual Leadership Development** – Pastor Nick requested that the council read the book "Spiritual Leadership" by Jay Oswald Sanders as a group. Council members were encouraged to share a personal update on their walk with Jesus and prayer requests for their families when they lead council devotions.
- **Prayer Retreat** – Ben shared a summary of the prayer retreat from which he and Pr. Nick had just returned. They prayed through the seven letters to the churches in Revelation and reflected on applications for Emmaus. The verse Revelation 3:7 was very impactful for both of them.
- **Vision Path** – The world has changed since we last revised our mission statement and we want to seek the Lord's will in creating a new statement that reflects His desire for Emmaus. We will continue to bring the mission statement before the Lord in prayer and if he is pleased to clarify and confirm a statement it will be the lens thorough which we will enter Vision Path 1 in August. All members of the congregation are invited to meet at 8:30 am each Tuesday morning in the sanctuary to seek the Lord's will and direction for a new mission statement for the church.

## **Old Business:**

- Motion (Finance Committee) to move funds from the foundation gift to the Building fund to cover the cost of purchasing and installing new projectors. Vote approved

## **New Business:**

- Nominating committee has requested direction from the council on establishing a Call committee for a new Associate Pastor.
- Motion (Mark) second (Tom) to empower the nominating committee to compile a list names for a call committee for a full-time associate pastor. Call Committee should be comprised of members who have a variety of ministry focuses/passions, who will pray for spiritual guidance, have spiritual maturity and discernment, and people who can devote the necessary time and effort to identifying the right person. Vote passed
