

Cravings

Matthew 5:6 – *"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."*

The hunger pains usually hit me around 4:00p. After a long day at the office, I tend to crave a big meal. I'll take tacos any day. I like hot dishes, sandwiches, and chicken wings too.

Cravings are a funny thing. If you start to eat certain things you love, you're bound to want them even more. It's not just routine or pickiness. My taste buds seem to have real opinions and preferences. How about you? What do you hunger and thirst for as the afternoon wears on?

In His Sermon On The Mount, as Jesus is in the midst of the Beatitudes, He uses the same kind of language as a metaphor for things we want and desire in life. We hunger for comfort, for pleasure, ease, and good times. There is nothing wrong with these things in and of themselves, but they are temporary and cannot satisfy us long-term. Then there are unrighteous desires and cravings. We lust, envy, and rage. We get slothful, gluttonous, greedy, and prideful. These desires can seem uncontrollable to many people.

Why do we think temporary or unrighteous desires would ever lead us to satisfaction?

The world tells us satisfaction comes from excitement, experience, and feelings. We sing about it. We obsess over things that leave us wanting more. We're willing to break the law for things we want, only to justify it with excuses. We want to be on time, so we speed or run a light that turns from yellow to red too quickly. We want our way, so we treat people with disrespect. We want to look at things we shouldn't, so we tell ourselves, "Everyone's doing it."

So Jesus offers a different perspective on God's standard for righteousness and on our pursuit of satisfaction. He tells us, "*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness.*" If we are honest, righteousness is not the foremost craving most people have these days. In fact, many would admit this is not a pursuit at all. At least not in how Jesus would define righteousness.

The term righteous means 'justice' or 'right-ness'. We could say holiness or purity. If anything, our pursuit of holiness is driven by fear of getting caught doing something we shouldn't or an effort to show others we are generally good people. But that kind of pursuit never leaves us satisfied. It's a shameful and never-ending fight.

So what is Jesus getting at? Where does the desire to live righteously come from? How might we be satisfied from hungering and thirsting for righteousness?

It might be helpful to know that Jesus is not saying, "*Blessed are those who try harder at being righteous.*" It's not that you hunger for righteousness first and then God will accept you or save you for your efforts. Our efforts fail us. We don't measure up. Even the good I do, or the bad I try to avoid, doesn't satisfy my heart.

What Jesus is really saying is "*Blessed are those who know the Righteous One.*" Because when you know the Righteous One, then you will hunger and thirst for what is right, because you know that His righteousness has satisfied. And this is where the blessing is. We need Jesus. Only He lived the perfect life, dying in our place, so that we could be made right with God. That is lasting satisfaction.

We have only just begun our new Home Group and Sermon Series, "**What Would Jesus Say** — A study in the Sermon On The Mount. I'm looking forward to digging deeply into this incredible teaching. Will you join us? There are Home Group studies seeking new members. There are study resources on our website, emmauslutheran.org, along with sermon videos and our pastor's podcast, which will focus on the Sermon On The Mount. I look forward to growing together in Christ.





Mission of the Month

Hope Centers for Children of Africa

Emmaus started supporting this ministry when it was under the leadership of former members Glen and Sherry Mork. When God laid the vision for this ministry on their hearts, the Morks began to see a new work unfold in the Republic of Congo that would change the hearts and lives of many people over the years to come.

Today, Hope Centers for Children of Africa (HCCA) is overseen by Pastor Jonathan Unverzagt. Their outreach efforts continue to bless the hearts of those who serve in the work that is being accomplished. Through education, microgrants, and self-sustaining projects, this ministry strives to improve the lives of persons involved in this partnership.

Hope Centers for Children of Africa has been helping widows and orphans in Luweero, Uganda, and Bugoro, Democratic Republic of Congo, for many years by providing microloans and helping put orphans through school. Currently, the Uganda location helps approximately 58 widows and 60 orphans, while the DRC location helps approximately 55 widows and over 200 orphans. The ministry is thriving and continually sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with the people in these areas.

HCCA desires to break the cycle of poverty through proven methods and also to combat dependency. The ministry is accomplishing these goals and just in this past year celebrated the graduation of 13 of their own students who have been supported by HCCA donations throughout their primary and secondary school years! The student representative spoke with great joy on their behalf: *"We didn't have hope for such a thing considering the means of our families. But we were chosen by your ministry and have been in your hands all these years. If we could, we would come all the long way from Bunia to America to see each one of you and thank you for paying for our fees and expenses and everything. There are still many others in the primary school now, and we wish they can become as we are today. Let our thanks reach every one of you."*

The house build costs \$6,500 for essential materials (walls, roof, windows, front door, and exterior paint), excluding interior items. Past donations helped the team provide additional essentials for families.

In 2024, the team was blessed with donations that helped offset the cost of materials and was able to take the family shopping for essentials. One of the kids (12 years old) was so excited that she was able to buy a set of 6 plastic hangers for her clothes. She didn't have a closet to put them in, but was able to put nails in the wall to hang them. The mother couldn't believe she could afford a full-length mirror for her living room. The team was also able to buy/build bed frames, mattresses, lights, and a kitchen stove top for the family.

Our team going to the Children's Home will also serve at Rafa's House. We have been fundraising to help these men get new beds, sheets, and pillows. Since they opened, they have been sleeping on used beds or on the ground because there aren't enough beds. We would love to replace all the beds with new ones and buy enough for every room. Our goal is to help these men get back on their feet and to have a set of sheets and a pillow they can take with them when they leave.

Thank you for your ongoing prayers and support, which enable us to continue these trips.

Opening Devotions: Eric R "The Sovereignty of God" Ephesians 1:9-10 – God is in control of all things; He governs the world and will make everything right in Christ. Jesus is the goal of all history.

Secretary Report: Approved by vote

Executive Committee Report: Paul

- Continuing to interview for the Front Office position. Karla has done an excellent job of bringing in temporary support
- Pastor Kevin has been in his position here at Emmaus for seven years. Executive Comm. is recommending a motion that he is provided a sabbatical this year from June 1 through August 15. Vote to approve: approved

Treasurer's Report: Al

- There were some additional expenses in December but giving was good also and we remain on budget
- Motion from Al to accept the December Financial report: Seconded. Vote and approved
- Emmaus has excess funds in the Operating Fund due to giving and lower expenses. However, access to the funds is limited to the size of our budget. Council is looking into ways to access those funds and put them to godly use.

Vision Path Evangelism Focus

- Discussed definition of "Evangelism" at Emmaus Church
- The youth students at Emmaus are currently going through "Collision Ministry" training, focusing on evangelism and making disciples.
- Discussed questions on Pastor Nick's evangelism form

Pastor Nick Report:

1. Corporate Stewardship Update

- We have sent out a letter to the congregation regarding year-end giving and a church financial update. As we continue to communicate our financial needs, we are also exploring other ways to encourage and challenge the church to make other financial contributions. During our council meeting, we will discuss year-end gifts, bequests, and how we will use them in the coming year. Some things to consider: Building needs/expenses, Marketing, Technology needs, Pastoral Intern

2. Vision Path

- As we officially began Vision and Partnering Phase 2 on January 1st, the Deacons board will continue to focus on Evangelism and Discipleship, serving as the acting Evangelism sub-committee. Our focus for January's meeting will be our written documentation of Evangelism definitions and expectations. This documentation will be presented during our council meeting.

3. New Sermon Series:

- On Sunday, January 25th, we begin a new Home Group study and Sermon Series in Matthew 5-6, Jesus' Sermon On The Mount. This study and series will take us through our Spring and Summer of 2026. The theme is "What Would Jesus Say?"

Pastor Kevin Report:

1. Missions

- The Mission Committee moved to give \$500 to Sri Lanka's flood relief.
- And a possible additional \$1000 if we receive the foundation grant.

2. The Tuesday Bible Study will be led by Pam Olson and will cover 1 & 2 Samuel.

3. Visitors – be encouraged by the visitors that we have coming to Emmaus

- Christmas Eve is always a time for family and friends to visit. 210 attended Christmas Eve
- We have recently had several visitors because of historical family connections, some of those have become regular attendees. One of them told me, "I wish I had started coming sooner."
- One member invited their neighbors who slowly started coming. Those neighbors invited their neighbor who recently started coming.
- One started coming because we as a church reached out to her when she lost her mom. She came and found several people that she knew already attending. Welcoming and Engaging Visitors is more than greeting on Sunday morning. It is inviting friends and neighbors. It is reaching out to people who are hurting. It is sharing a meal with someone, and it is making our worship available to everyone
- online. It means meeting people where they are at and finding common ground.

4. Bangladesh and Cambodia, with students from Myanmar – January 4-16

- Thank you for praying for this current trip. It is an intense trip with three days of teaching in each country. We are praying that they will understand the oral strategy for education and that they will be able to use the curriculum after this introduction. Franklin Graham will also be in Cambodia later in January

Old Business:


