



What is new this year?

Happy New Year is a nice greeting for others and probably a good personal reminder for us. I pray that 2026 will be a happy new year, but that greeting leads me to ask two important questions. What will make it happy, and what will make it new? I set goals every year, and many times they are the same goals as the previous year. Personal health, financial goals, and family priorities are all important to consider each year. They are good items to evaluate, but are they new, and will they make you happy?

We look for happiness in this world, but it doesn't last. Some things can give us temporary pleasure, but those pursuits will leave us empty, searching, and longing for more. Cravings are only temporarily satisfied; stuff doesn't last, and the recognition of our accomplishments fades. When we fill the elusive perception of happiness with things that are temporary, we will find that the emptiness grows. We need a joy that is outside of ourselves, one that doesn't fade, and one that is lasting.

In Matthew 6:19–21, Jesus said, *"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."* In the book of John, Jesus said that the pain of childbirth gives way to the joy of the baby's birth, and then He said, *"I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you."* When we look to the things of this earth for happiness, we will be disappointed because everything on earth decays, including ourselves. But our joy in Christ can never be taken away. You can find joy in a relationship with Jesus, but it means giving up the pursuit of earth's temporary pleasures.

The second question is, "What is new?" 2 Corinthians 5:17 describes how "new" happens. It says, "*Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.*" Jesus can make us fully new. He can give us a new heart, new desires, new priorities, and a new future. His "new" doesn't depend on whether the next year is a repeat of the last year. We all have situations that require perseverance and faithfulness, but the transformation that Jesus gives is a change in perspective. He can change our attitude toward the things that are ahead of us. We can anticipate a new future rather than just endure it when Jesus is in control over what is ahead.

Let's look at 2026 as an opportunity for Jesus to be our joy as we anticipate how He is going to lead us into new adventures.

It is so fun to start the New Year with you! I am so grateful for your love and support for so many years!

I share with you, month by month, and you hold up our children and their families through prayer. I thought that you might like to see examples of the fruit of those prayers!



Let's start way back. In 2011, Cleberson came to us at just six years old. He had gone through terrible experiences before he arrived; it is hard to believe that a six-year-old could be broken, but Cleber was. We praise the Lord for Claudinae and Julian, who adopted this child and loved him through every storm! Today, Cleber is a powerful young man of 20, who is part of the worship team at church and an amazing big brother to his younger siblings (also adopted). God moved through your prayers to bring healing to this precious child!

A few years later (six to be exact) João and Janaina arrived. True orphans, the children have aunts and uncles, but none who were willing to receive them.
