





BEHOLD!

This week as the newsletter goes out, our youth are at the Free Lutheran Youth Convention in Colorado. The FLY Convention is held in Estes Park, CO every two years and the theme for this year is BEHOLD. Estes Park is the entrance to Rocky Mountain National Park, so it is easy to behold some magnificent sights. The mountains are majestic, the deer and elk are graceful, and there are 1500 youth worshipping God saying, "Yes" to Jesus.

While the sights are magnificent and the worship is energetic, the goal of our time is to behold God. How do you do that? We can see what He has made. We can see where He is at work. We can read about Him in His Word, but what does it mean to behold God? What does it mean to see, know, and experience Him? Several people in the Bible saw God in real and tangible ways and we can get a glimpse of what it would look like through their eyes.

Isaiah recorded his vision of God in chapter 6. First, he heard the seraphim proclaiming "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!" Then Isaiah said, "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphim flew to him with coal and touched his lips and said, "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for." Then Isaiah heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then he said, "Here I am! Send me."

When we behold God, our sin is revealed, and our guilt is exposed, but that same Lord is the one who cleanses us, pays for our sins, and calls us to serve Him. He transforms us from "people of unclean lips" to people sent to proclaim His greatness.

Moses saw God when he was on the mountain receiving the Ten Commandments. God allowed Moses to see his backside when he passed by. Exodus 34:29 says, "When Moses came down from Mount Sinai, with the two tablets of the testimony in his hand as he came down from the mountain, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God." Moses was changed when he saw God. His face glowed and everyone could see the difference. Our faces do reflect what we look at. If we are anxious or angry, our faces reveal that emotion. The same is true if we feel God's peace or love, we reflect Him. When we spend time with the Lord, His character shines through us.

Mary Magdalene saw Jesus after the resurrection. The angels told her to go and tell the disciples. Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshiped him. Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me." Jesus defeated death and His resurrection means that we also have victory, even over death, and the anticipation of seeing Him in His glory.

The point is that when we behold the Lord, it will change us. It is not possible to be touched by Jesus and remain the same. Allowing Him into our lives has an immediate effect as well as an ongoing impact. We, as a church, exist to bring people into personal fellowship with the Lord. Our primary mission is to go and tell what we have seen.

As you read this newsletter, consider how and when you could behold the Lord and consider how you could introduce someone to Him.



Mission of the Month Andrew and Alexis Olson

Our missionary focus for the month of July is, Missionaries Andrew and Alexis Olson, and their family who work with the ministry of, "They Need the Bible". We are blessed to fellowship with the Olsons at Emmaus, as God uses them to share his word around the world. Here is a quick update on some of the things that are happening with this exciting ministry.

50 languages now have access to the gospel on YouTube through the ministry of Addie Allen. She has been making the gospel available on YouTube through beautiful art time-lapses. In addition to these time-lapses, she has also been producing language-learning phrasebooks for each of the micro-languages we've encountered. We look forward to our continued partnership with Addie and thank God for her special calling.

In 2025 we began a partnership with Lutheran Bible Translators, to expand our translation goals for a number of languages in Indonesia. In June, we concluded a 12-week Bible transition translation training course.

Please be praying. It is the first time that the Bible has been available in these languages. We know that this is a spiritual undertaking, yet we know that "the Battle Belongs to the Lord." Our work is growing and the need for staff has also grown with it. For a long time, we've wondered "When will be the right time to bring on additional teammates?"

That's been a matter of prayer, preparation, and discernment for about 3 years. In June our board voted to create two new part-time missionary roles. Similar to how our families Ministry runs, these will be support-based positions that depend on the support of the church and donors. Please pray for an outpouring of blessing upon these new positions.

House of Hope




