

Meeting Needs Not Wants

As a church, I think we are aware of the incredible need in our world today. Crisis, poverty, homelessness, abandonment, famine, sickness, and abuse. From our city to around the world in every community. Corruption, selfishness, and violence continue to dominate the world. Leaving so many people lost and lonely, without hope. Of course, our greatest need is the spiritual need, and we live in a world lost and dying without the hope of eternity with Jesus Christ. So, how do we address such a problem?

In Acts 3, we have the miraculous story of the Apostle Peter healing a paralyzed man. This is one of the earliest accounts of the church fathers worshiping together following the resurrection and ascension of Jesus. As the disciples are going into the temple courts, they pass a panhandler on the street. There is a reason this man is begging. We learn in our story that he is paralyzed. Imagine what life would have been like for him in the first century. Peter immediately asked the man to look up and meet him face-to-face. I would imagine the man was startled by this request. How many times have we looked away at someone begging? As the man looked up, Peter, without hesitation, famously proclaimed, **"I have no silver and gold, but what I do have I give to you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, rise up and walk!"**

As the story continues, the lame man was completely healed, and because of this, the man was so overjoyed that he went into the temple courts, walking, leaping, and praising God. Of course, this story is about so much more than the healing of his legs. He needed more than a meal, a new set of clothes, or a momentary fix. He needed what all the world needs: forgiveness and cleansing through Jesus Christ.

It is also important to note that before his healing, he would not have been allowed into the temple, as he was considered spiritually unclean. The Pharisaical law would prohibit him from entering worship because of the past sins of his forefathers and his apparent uncleanness. So this story is intentional. God, through His Word, is revealing to us what worship in the New Covenant looks like for us today. Jesus shed His blood on the Cross so that all people would have the opportunity to enter into fellowship with God. He sent His Son so that we all could have a saving relationship with God for eternity. Although we could never earn our way back, we would always need His grace. This story gives us a true picture of what it looks like to meet the real need in our world today. We are all saved by grace through faith in Jesus.

In light of this, we should be cautious not to overlook the details provided in our story. First, Peter and John could not give this man what he had asked for because they did not have what he wanted. Was this intentional on God's part? Did God hold back from giving Peter and John monetary blessings so that they would see the real need? I think so. He gives us what we need, not always what we want, because He knows how we will handle it. He always has a greater plan. How might we apply this to ministry? God will provide and use what we have for His glory. The question is, will we respond in 'faith' rather than in 'feeling' to the real need of the world?

Secondly, Peter and John show us here how the church should approach evangelism and discipleship. Notice that they didn't shy away from the lame man's greater spiritual need. They didn't ignore him. They did what they could in order to meet the need he had to enter into the fellowship of the saints. They couldn't meet every need. Instead, they responded with intentional and whole-hearted openness to what He truly needed, not what he wanted—also, trusting God for His grace and healing.

How often do we respond to someone's need to quickly move on from what is uncomfortable to us? Do we meet needs out of guilt? Do we meet needs to show others that we care about them? Or do we intentionally and wholeheartedly look to meet the needs of our world for the greater good of the Kingdom?

As our church begins a new fiscal year this July 2025, the leadership will be wrestling with a new vision for church-wide evangelism and discipleship. As we look to meet the need within our fellowship and in our communities, please pray and consider how the Lord is leading you in fulfilling the Great Commission. Further, please pray specifically for a fresh vision that we would be intentional and wholeheartedly committed to reaching our world for Jesus Christ.

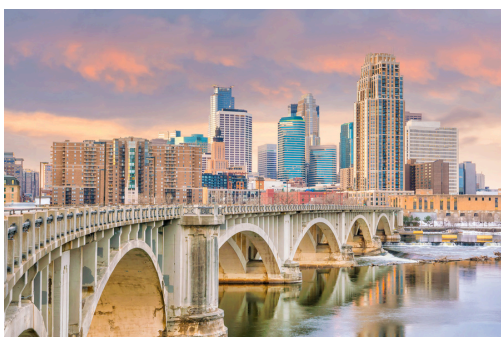

The Emmaus Family has been blessed to partner with Maureen for many years. We first met when she worked with "Child Evangelism Fellowship" and offered training for our Youth and Children's Ministry volunteers. What a blessing she has been to so many at Emmaus and around the world. Now an update from Maureen...



I've been sitting here reflecting on all the incredible ways God is moving through KidZ at Heart lately, and I just had to share some of the joy with you! Here is what's bringing me joy right now: WE ARE PLANTING SEEDS! (1 Corinthians 3:6-9). In the first quarter of 2025, KidZ at Heart has trained over 300 leaders. This exceeds the number of leaders trained within all of 2024!! Communities everywhere are encountering Jesus in real, life-changing ways! And this is all made possible because we are making this impact together! Because of your investment, individuals, children, and entire communities are knowing the impact of a deeper relationship with Jesus. Because YOU are part of the KidZ Community, this impact is seen throughout Latin America, Southeast Asia, Africa, and the Middle East. YOU are vital to making this possible!



Here are some important highlights from the first quarter: New trainings are launching in Latin America and Southeast Asia. A brand new location in Nepal, and in April, 2 brand new locations in the Philippines- all of this in our Asia region. In Africa, new locations are opening up across the continent! Within the first quarter of this year, we have seen 2 new locations, each in Zimbabwe and Kampala, and 1 location each in Burundi, Lesotho, Rwanda, and Kenya. In the Middle East and Northern Africa, despite some areas experiencing unrest, we have continued to facilitate training in Lebanon, Sudan, Syria, Qatar, Egypt, and Jordan. And while these staggering numbers and successes bring us great reason to rejoice, we remain on our knees as there is a deep hunger for more! A hunger for more trained leaders, more networks, and more locations so that more families, children, and communities can encounter the Holy Spirit and deepen their relationship with God.

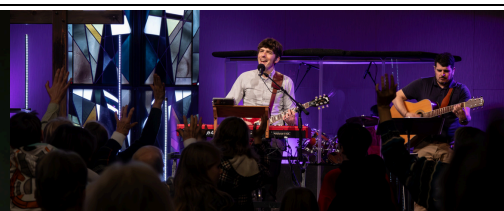
