







### How Do You See Yourself?

Romans 12:3 - "For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned."

How do you see yourself? We are all very capable of exaggerating how we perceive our own opinions, gifts, and talents. We do it in the way we seek attention, whether good or bad. We do, at times, when we look in the mirror, face-to-face. We may not always like what we see, but we compare and contrast what we have versus what other people have. We do it in how we negatively perceive people's actions, believing we would never do those things ourselves. Or when we point a finger and blame others for the problems we create.

In Romans 12:3, the Apostle Paul instructs the church at Rome not to think more highly of themselves than they ought to, no matter their talents and gifts within the church. Once again, we have a passage of Scripture addressing the importance of our mindset. Directly before this verse, Paul talks about being transformed by the renewal of our minds. Through the righteousness of Christ freely given to those cleansed by His shed blood on the Cross of Calvary, the believer is transformed into the thinking of Jesus, rejecting the world's mindset.

So instead of inflating our self-view, we must think with sober judgement. Paul instructs us to have a mindset that aligns with the measure of faith that God has assigned to each one of us. What does this mean?

What comes to mind first is that our measure of faith and spiritual gifts is just that, a gift. We didn't earn it. God is generous and blesses us in accordance with His plan and purposes. We cannot take any credit for what we did not produce. To think with sober judgment in the context is to judge ourselves accordingly. The church exists to glorify God as we fulfill his plan on earth as it is in heaven. Everything we do must magnify Him and not ourselves.

Secondly, we have all been placed on this earth for something eternal and significant. Our gifts are given proportionately to fill and complete what God intended in the right time and place. The wrong measurements will prevent the building project from being completed or the product from being correct. Too much of something and you take away from other important ingredients. Too little and you risk the whole thing. The church at Rome must have had the same problem we tend to have today. We put too much emphasis on certain people, specific gifts, and the amounts given. Or we look at our gifts and proportions and deem them too little and insignificant to make a difference.

If we are going to grow as the collective body, we need to operate in our gifts. Maturity does not come from having gifts, nor ensures we will be spiritually mature. Spiritual maturity comes from a transformed heart and mind operating in the correct role and being receptive to God's Spirit at work. So, just as Paul says, "Let us use them," regardless of the amount and gift. And let us work together in unity for the sake of Jesus' name.








# Praying Around the World

# Mission of the Month Chosen People

Chosen People Ministries will be our mission of focus throughout the month of October at Emmaus. We are excited that we have a local branch that we partner with in the Minneapolis area, as well as being involved in their worldwide outreach ministry to Jewish People.



The Jewish population is one of the most unreached in the world. Out of 15 million Jewish people around the world, less than 1% of them believe in Jesus. Every day, Chosen People Ministries strives to find new and effective ways to reach Jewish people around the world with the good news of the Jewish Messiah, Jesus.

In 1894, over 131 years ago, in Brooklyn, New York, Rabbi Leopold Cohn founded the mission to share the knowledge of Yeshua (Jesus) the Messiah with God's chosen people. He founded his work upon faith, in response to Romans 1:16, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek." The ministry's first Bible meeting was attended by 8 Jewish people. The Lord continued to bless this work, and in the course of his lifetime, Leopold Cohn led more than 1,000 people to the Lord.



Today, Chosen People Ministries serves over 20 countries, proclaiming the gospel among Jewish people around the world and training fellow believers to reach their Jewish friends, family, and neighbors. The ministry currently has over 130 missionaries. Chosen People Ministries exists to pray for, evangelize, disciple, and serve Jewish people and help fellow believers to do the same. The Emmaus family is blessed to join Chosen People Ministries, as we come alongside them prayerfully and financially.
